and inserts in its place another apparently of his own invention in a most disconcerting manner. The leadalet which you enclose is the same that was printed at the end of the "Outline", as you will no doubt remember. The paragraphs were written by Mrs. Besant.

Fullerton did write to me giving the disast rous result of the deliberations of his representative committee as to Raja's visit, but he did not explain in the least any of their reasons. Those reasons, however, are in reality of no importance. The fact remains that their foolishness has the lost them an exceedingly fine opportunity.
