In the *Mûlamadhyamaka-kârika*, Nagarjuna, the great Buddhist philosopher, points to the ending of all views as Sunyata, emptiness, the ultimate reality:

The victorious ones have said
That emptiness is the relinquishing of all views.
For whomever emptiness is a view,
That one has accomplished nothing.

I prostrate to Gautama
Who through compassion
Taught the true doctrine,
Which leads to the relinquishing of
all views.
